CONTAINER ISSUED	All single-family and multi-family have recycling and organics service. 96 gal, 64 gal, 32 gal, and 24 gal carts are available upon request. Call Recology South Bay to request a different cart size. SFD: One 64 gal. commingle recycling cart, one 96 gal. organics cart (yard trimmings and food scrap). MFD: Containers issued varies with location. All MFDs have organics service as of July 1, 2018. Most have toters, but a few have front loaders (dumpsters). NOTE: organics containers should be green but may have a few brown ones that still need to be exchanged. Recycling containers are blue, except for a few multi-family and commercial bins which are still white and need to be exchanged.

SOLID WASTE ORDINANCES	 Foam Food Ware Container Ordinance: Ordinance NO. 14 -2116, adopted in 2014, restricts distribution of food containers made from polystyrene foam (known as StyrofoamTM). Commercial Organics Ordinance: Requires high generators of food waste to separate food, yard and compostable paper waste for collection by Recology and composting. As of July 1, 2018, all commercial accounts that generate 4 or more cubic yards of solid waste per week and all multifamily properties are required to subscribe to organics recycling services. Reusable Bag Ordinance: Adopted in 2013, prohibits the distribution of thin, plastic carry-out bags. Single-use Plastic Foodware Ordinance: Adopted in Sept 2022. Implementation starts September 23. Restricts the use of single-use plastic dishware for dining-in, all take-out and to-go containers must be compostable or reusable. Learn more at Cupertino.org/foodware
